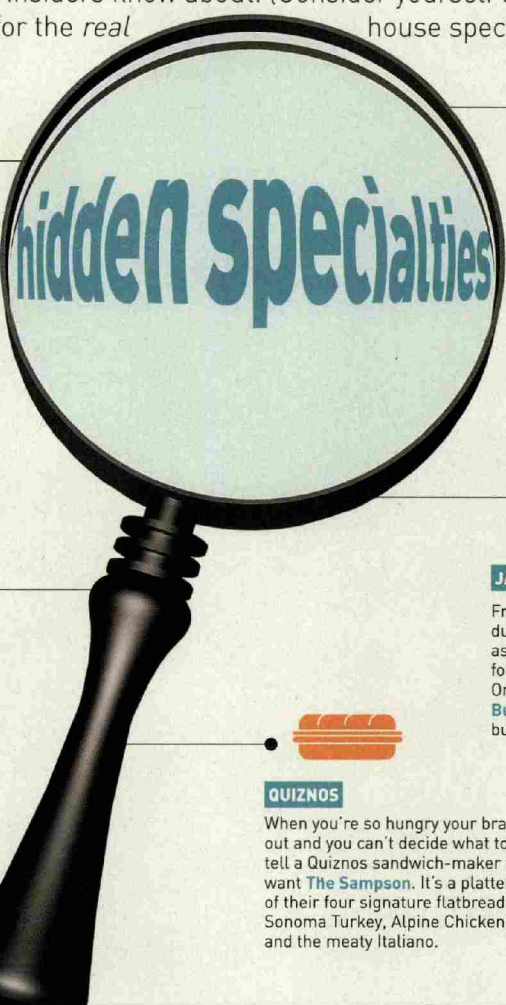

IN-N-OUT BURGER

Some topping combinations have become so popular at these West Coast burger joints that they've been named on in-n-out.com—an "Animal Style" burger comes with mustard, pickles and grilled onions. But we uncovered some top-secret burger breeds you won't even find on the site. Meat lovers pant over the **Flying Dutchman**: two patties, no bun. You can also mix things up by asking for a **Neopolitan Shake**. It's chocolate, vanilla and strawberry.



CHILI'S GRILL & BAR

You won't find a chili cheeseburger on a Chili's dinner menu—but don't let that stop you. Go vintage and special-order the **Tertingua Pride**, which graced the original menu in 1975. It comes with chili, cheddar cheese, pickles and onions. Just don't expect to pay the old price (it cost \$1.85 back then!).



COLD STONE CREAMERY

You won't see them in the toppings tray, but some branches of this chain stock honey and marshmallows behind the scenes. Create a dulce de leche concoction with French vanilla ice cream, honey, cinnamon and caramel. Servers will also dish up anything from the list of retired combinations, like the decadent **Rocky Road Trip**, made of chocolate ice cream, almonds and marshmallows.



JAMBA JUICE

Fresh-fruit smoothies are the order du jour here, but when customers ask for their favorite candy in liquid form, Jamba Juice happily obliges. One quirky combo tastes like a **Butterfinger**: chocolate, peanut butter, carrot juice and frozen yogurt.



QUIZNOS

When you're so hungry your brain checks out and you can't decide what to order, tell a Quiznos sandwich-maker that you want **The Sampson**. It's a platter of each of their four signature flatbread sammies: Sonoma Turkey, Alpine Chicken, Bistro Beef and the meaty Italiano.
